

## ARIZONA FEATURES

1. AMARG- Davis Monthan AFB “Boneyard” - Aerospace Maintenance and Regeneration Group- Military aircraft “graveyard”, more than 4,200 aircraft in various stages of preservation. Tours available from Pima Air and Space Museum. Many old P-3’s.
2. Pima Air & Space Museum - where history takes flight, is one of the largest air and space museums in the world, and the largest non-government funded aviation museum. You'll see more than 275 aircraft and spacecraft including many of the most historically significant and technically advanced craft ever produced, both from the United States and throughout the world
3. The Titan Missile Museum - is the only publicly accessible Titan II missile site in the nation. Tour the underground missile site. See the 3-ton blast doors, the 8-foot thick silo walls, and an actual Titan II missile in the launch duct. Daily tours
4. Saguaro National Park - The saguaro has been described as the monarch of the Sonoran Desert, as a prickly horror, as the supreme symbol of the American Southwest, and as a plant with personality. It is renowned for the variety of odd, all too human shapes it assumes, shapes that inspire wild and fanciful imaginings. Giant saguaro cacti, unique to the Sonoran Desert, sometimes reach a height of 50 feet in this cactus forest, which covers the valley floor, rising into the Rincon and West Tucson mountains.
5. Numerous local golf courses.
6. Nearby Nogales, Mexico 40 miles South on I-19. By 2009 passports will be required to cross the border and return to the US.
7. Casinos - 4 local in Tucson and Sahuarita on Indian Reservation.
8. Shopping in Tucson and Nogales.
9. Old Tucson – Many western movies made here “Rio Lobo,” “Gunsmoke,” etc.
10. Desert Museum- a natural zoo featuring desert wildlife.
11. Mt. Lemon, 9000 ft - featuring a quaint Ski village and ski lift operable in summer nearby easy beautifully scenic drive.
12. Many great Southwestern (Mexican) restaurants.
